What's the UK's favourite car colour?





In 2017, black was the most popular colour of new cars purchased according to the Society of Motor Manufacturers and Traders. More than half a million black cars, 1 in 5 of all new sales, were sold last year. White was the most popular colour in 2016, but is now in third place, with grey in second.

The fastest growing colour of 2017 was gold! Although it remained quite a low choice with only 2 out of every 1000 new cars being sold. Aside from colour, 2017 wasn't a great year for car sales, as new purchases fell for the first time in six years.


Peter the Picture News bear is back!
