


# Class 3 Newsletter



Dear parents and carers,

I would just like to start off by saying a massive **thank you** for everything that you have done for your child in Class 3, as well as myself and our school **throughout** the lockdown period. Your children have been **incredible** and it has been lovely to see such **resilience** in them all! It was a very challenging experience for everyone but we have made it to the other side (fingers and toes crossed)!



Through the rest of this term and leading up to May half term we have lots of exciting things happening in Class 3 that I would like to tell you about.

## Topic:

In Topic we are finally starting to learn about the Stone Age to the Iron Age. Our question is, 'Would you prefer to live in prehistoric Britain or Britain today?'. The children are already so **excited** about starting to learn about this and have a lot of questions that they want to find the answers to! I'm excited to see where they take this.

## Maths:

In Maths we are picking back up our topic of shapes from where we left off during virtual learning. We will be looking more closely at drawing 2D shapes, identifying right angles and also learning more about 3D shapes. After Easter half term we will then be moving onto measure.

### English:

For English, we have begun looking at adventure stories, linking this to our Topic focus. The children all did really well on their independent cold write, so I'm sure their hot writes at the end of our English unit will be **amazing**! In the new term we will then be focusing on non-chronological reports.

### Science:

During Science we are carrying on learning about forces and magnets. Now that the children are back we can be much more practical! After half term we will be linking Science to our Stone Age topic by focussing on rocks and fossils.

### Just a reminder:

- PE is now on a Wednesday and a Thursday until further notice.
- Reading must be done **at least** three times a week and reading record signed. If your child's record is not signed, they will miss some of their break time to read to a member of staff. If your child has misplaced their Reading Record, then you can purchase a new one via the Parent Mail app.
- TTRS must also be done a **minimum** of three times a week.
- Homework is given out on a Thursday and due back in the following Tuesday. This will commence after Easter half term.
- Home learning books need to be returned to school.
